The Owen War Horses scored touchdowns on four of their first five possessions en route to a 29-14 over Mountain Heritage Thursday night at Owen High School.

The War Horses drives were aided by four long runs, three of which went for scores. The Cougars got the opening kick and were forced to punt by the Owen defense. On the second play of their first possession, the War Horses' Kendrick Green ran 60 yards for the first score of the game. Sam Howell blocked the point after attempt and Owen held a 6-0 lead. After stopping the Cougars again, Owen got the ball back on their 46 and scored another touchdown on a drive that featured a 36 yard run by their back where he broke numerous tackles. The War Horses added the two point conversion and took a 14-0 lead into the second quarter.

The Cougars on their next possession took over at their 20 and marched down the field for their first score on a four yard run by Howell. The touchdown capped the possession where Howell accounted for 60 yards of rushing. After adding the two point conversion, the score stood at 14-8. However, Owen answered on the ensuing possession with a 44 yard run and after adding the two point conversion lead 22-8 at half.

On their first possession of the second half, Owen appeared to be stopped. However, the Cougars were called for a face mask penalty providing new life to the Owen offense. Once again, Green had a long touchdown run and after adding the extra point Owen held a 29-8 lead.

The Cougar offense had one more long touchdown drive covering 84 yards capped by a three yard run by Luis Romero. The conversion failed, and that provided the final scoring of the night.

The Cougars record in conference fell to 1-2 and their overall record to 4-2. The JV Cougars are idle next week and return to actiom on October 22 when they travel to Mitchell.
